Waterbeach

Covid Support

At the end of this municipal year we reflect back on a period with a degree of return to normality as we move hopefully to a more post Covid world. As a council we have continued to support the district with the recovery of the community and businesses. Waterbeach businesses benefited from some of the £43.9 million in government grants that the Council distributed to support their recovery from Covid. The Reopening the High Streets team handled over 1,500 in-person visits and around 300 enquiries or complaints, interacting with 3,000 businesses throughout the district.

Environment

The ever popular Zero Carbon Community grant scheme is now open for its fourth round of grant applications with specific focuses on reducing carbon emissions or locking up carbon, and on community engagement on climate change. If you have a project in mind do get in touch with any of us as local members for endorsement and support. In the last round of funding, St John's church were successful in applying for the maximum grant to replace the church hall heating system with a low carbon heat pump.

Planning and Local Plan

The Council continues to maintain a five-year housing land supply which for the next year (April to April) is 6.5 years. This means that as a planning authority we have far more control over where development should go, in the right places with amenities provided, and in accordance with the adopted Local Plan. At the same time we continue to work on the Greater Cambridge Local Plan which is at the First Proposal stage in the process. Development will be in the right places, close to jobs and good transport links, as new towns are built out (within the current Local Plan's allocation) and only nineteen new sites are being proposed safeguarding villages. There are no new proposed sites within the ward.

With support from South Cambs the Waterbeach Neighbourhood was 'made'. After many years of work this is a tremendous achievement by everyone involved and will help to guide planning decisions throughout Waterbeach as it grows. The Neighbourhood Plan contains 24 policies. These have a legal status that will need to be considered when planning applications are brought forward for review. The Neighbourhood Plan area extends from north of Chittering to south of Car Dyke and from the A10 to the river Cam. The whole of Waterbeach New Town is within this area. Supporting evidence for the Neighbourhood Plan includes a Design Principles document, a Heritage and Character Assessment Document, a Housing Needs Assessment Report, and a Demographic and Socio-economic review. Anyone with an interest in planning matters in Waterbeach should read the plan.

Ukranian refugees

The council has recently been supporting people in Waterbeach to host Ukrainian refugees. There is a considerable amount of work in ensuring suitability of accommodation and supporting both the hosts and refugees. South Cambs has amongst the highest, if not the highest, number of refugees housed per head of population under the Homes for Ukraine scheme.
